## Major Ethical Normative theories

- · Utilitarianism (consequential) Bentham + Mills
  - · Best Interest of the majority will make us All happy
  - · Not About Right VS. Wrong
- · Kastianism/positivism (NON-Consequential) Kant
  - · Categorical Imperative
  - . there Are Absolute Truths Absolute Rights VS. Wrongs
  - · Religious + NATURA Sciences Approach
  - · the Rule of Law, the word of God etc ...
- · Relativism (virtue Ethics) Plato + Aristotle
  - · there are no universal Troths or Universal Rights/wrongs
  - · What matters is the person's Personal charachter;
    -Did the individual believe he was Doing the Right thing?

Plato: was the individual Ethical?


Kant: was the Act Ethical?

Mills: Is this best for Society at Large?






